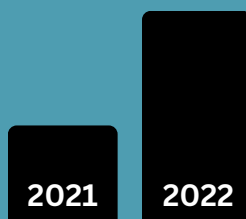

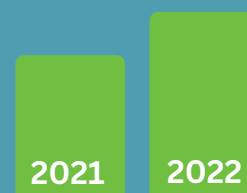


SUPPORT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE CONTINUES TO GROW

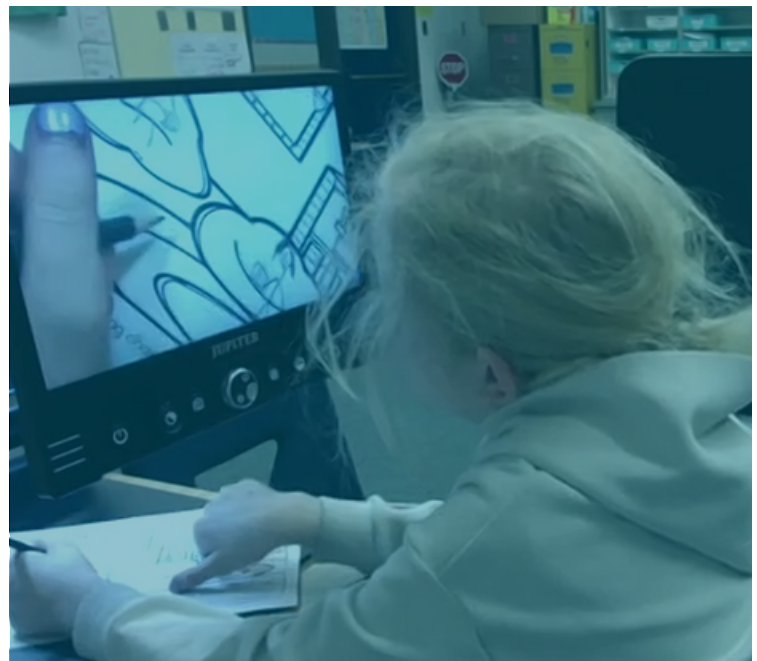
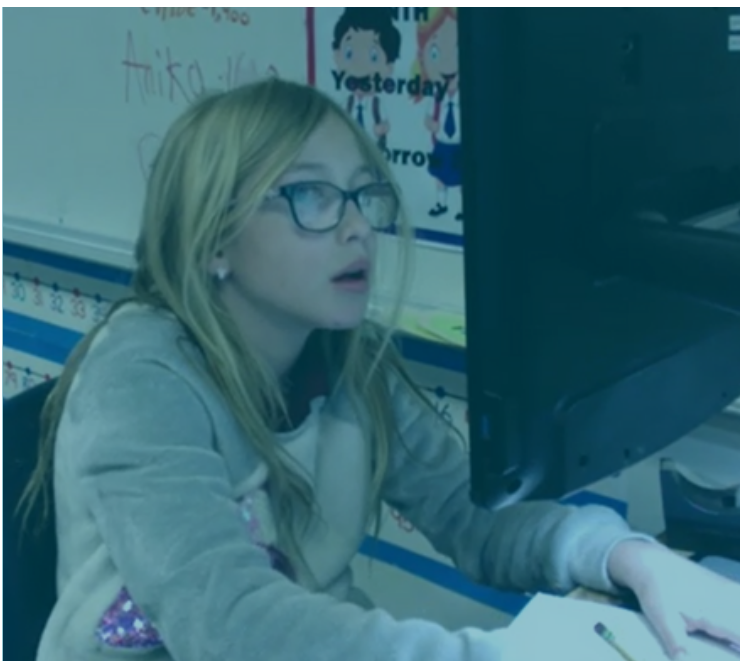
VOICES FOR VISTA

Client Success

Kelly is a senior living with Macular Degeneration. When she first came to Vista Center, she expressed frustration about the limitations her vision loss was creating. Although Kelly could read print, she was discouraged that she was only able to read for about 10 minutes at a time before her vision condition became too much of an obstacle.



As a result of engaging with Vista Center, Kelly improved her reading ability. Through support group sessions, Kelly made friends who understand her, and that she now feels less isolated and has a safe place to voice frustrations about her vision loss journey.

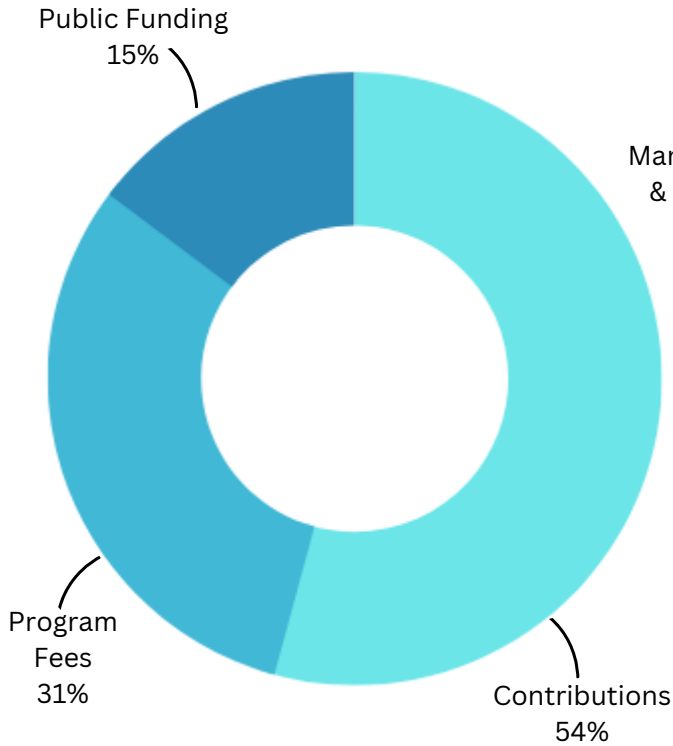

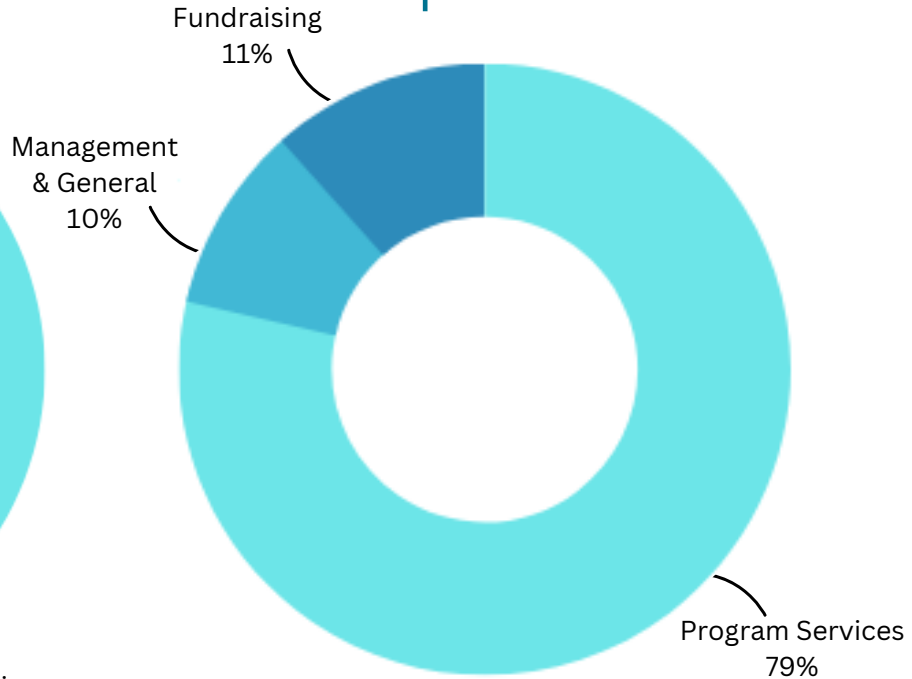
